# Herbs that Stop Bleeding

#### Types of bleeding:

- nosebleed
- coughing up blood
- vomiting blood
- blood in the stool
- blood in the urine
- profuse menses
- abnormal uterine bleeding (spotting, bleeding during pregnancy)
- bleeding due to trauma

# **Herbs that Stop Bleeding**

Causes of internal bleeding:

- 1. blood stasis
- 2. blood heat
- 3. deficiency cold
- **Blood Stasis:** stagnation obstructs the normal passageway, forcing blood to move outside of the vessel
- **Blood Heat:** excessive yang quickens the blood and causes it to move recklessly outside of the vessel
- **Deficiency Cold:** Because of Spleen yang deficiency, the Spleen fails in its function of holding blood inside the vessels, and the blood leaks out

Many of these herbs can be used in their charred form to enhance their ability to stop bleeding.

Most herbs in this category enter the Liver channel.

Taste:	<ul> <li>Acrid (if they invigorate)</li> <li>Bitter (if they clear heat)</li> <li>Some of these herbs are astringent as well</li> </ul>

Main Action:	<ul> <li>Invigorate blood to stop bleeding</li> <li>Clear heat and cool blood to stop bleeding</li> <li>Induce astringency to stop bleeding</li> <li>Warm the channels to stop bleeding</li> </ul>
Cautions & Contraindications:	<ul><li>Herbs that invigorate blood should be used with caution during pregnancy</li><li>Herbs that clear heat should not be used with cold patterns</li></ul>
Other:	<ul> <li>These herbs should be combined with other herbs that treat the underlying conditions (e.g. Herbs that Invigorate Blood, Herbs that Clear Heat, etc.)</li> <li>Many herbs can be used in their charred form (tan)</li> </ul>

## sān qī notoginseng radix

Temp: warm Taste: sweet, slightly bitter Channels: LV, ST Dosage: 3-9 grams (crush before decocting)

#### 1. invigorates blood to stop bleeding

• for external or internal bleeding (nosebleed, vomiting blood, blood in urine or stool)

#### 2. invigorates blood to stop pain

• esp. for injury and trauma



Can be taken as a single herb: crush into powder and swallow with alcohol. Use caution during pregnancy.

## **qiàn cǎo** rubiae radix

Temp: cold Taste: bitter Channels: HT, LV Dosage: 9-15grams

- 1. clears heat to stop bleeding
  - for any type of bleeding due to heat
- 2. invigorates blood
  - stops bleeding and stops pain
  - for amenorrhea, injury/trauma, joint pain

Qian Cao (or Qian Cao Gen) treats bleeding due to both heat and blood stagnation, such as when heat dries out the blood and causes stasis.

# **dà jì** cirsi japonici herba seu radix

Temp: cool Taste: sweet Channels: LV, SP, HT Dosage: 9-15 grams

- 1. clears heat to stop bleeding
  - esp. for bleeding in the upper body (vomiting blood, coughing up blood)
  - also for blood in urine or stool, uterine bleeding
- 2. clears heat toxicity to treat skin infection
- 3. clears damp-heat to treat jaundice
- 4. lowers high blood pressure

**Da Ji** treats bleeding in the upper body (Da means "large"). **Xiao Ji** treats bleeding in the lower body (Xiao means "small"). This Da Ji does not contradict Gan Cao. That's a different Da Ji (harsh expellant).

## **xiǎo jì** cirsi herba

Temp: cool Taste: sweet Channels: LV, HT Dosage: 9-30 grams

- 1. clears heat to stop bleeding
- 2. promotes urination
- 3. clears heat toxicity to treat skin infection
- 4. clears damp-heat to treat jaundice
- 5. lowers high blood pressure

Da Ji treats bleeding in the upper body (Da means "large"). Xiao Ji treats bleeding in the lower body (Xiao means "small").



# **dì yú** sanguisorbae radix

Temp: slightly cold Taste: bitter, sour Channels: LV, ST, LI Dosage: 9-15 grams

#### 1. clears heat to stop bleeding

 esp. for hemorrhoids, bloody dysentery, excessive uterine bleeding (flooding and spotting)

#### 2. clears heat toxicity

- for sores and bed sores
- for burns and scalds
- use externally

To stop bleeding, Di Yu is best used in its charred form (Di Yu Tan) .

## huái mǐ sophorae flos immaturus

Temp: cool Taste: bitter Channels: LV, LI Dosage: 4.5-9 grams

- 1. clears heat to stop bleeding
  - esp. for hemorrhoids, bloody dysentery

#### 2. clears Liver heat

• for red eyes, head ache, and dizziness





Huai Mi is also called Huai Hua Mi (槐花米). Hua means flower.

## **cè bǎi yè** platycladi cacumen

Temp: slightly cold Taste: bitter, astringent Channels: LU, LV, LI Dosage: 6-15 grams

- 1. clears heat to stop bleeding
  - astringent; can be used for bleeding due to heat or cold
- 2. transforms phlegm and stops cough
  - for thick, difficult-to-expectorate, blood-streaked phlegm due to heat in the Lung
- 3. used externally for burns and scalds

### bái máo gēn imperatae rhizoma

Temp: cold Taste: sweet Channels: LU, ST, UB, SI Dosage: 9-30 grams

#### 1. clears heat to stop bleeding

- for bloody sputum
- for blood in the urine (xue lin)
- 2. promotes urination
  - for heat-pattern lin syndrome
- 3. clears Lung and Stomach heat
  - for nausea and thirst; wheezing



## xiān hè cǎo argrimoniae herba

Temp: neutral Taste: bitter, astringent Channels: LV, LU, UB Dosage: 6-12 grams

- 1. induces astringency to stop bleeding
  - can be used for heat, cold, excess, or deficiency, depending on combination
- 2. stops diarrhea and dysentery
  - for chronic problems; induces astringency
- 3. kills parasites
  - for tapeworm
  - for trichomonas vaginitis and itchy genitals (use topically)

## **bái jí** bletillae rhizoma

Temp: cool Taste: bitter, sweet, astringent Channels: LU, LV, ST Dosage: 3-15 grams

#### 1. induces astringency to stop bleeding

- esp. for LU/ST bleeding
  - vomiting blood, coughing blood, nosebleed
  - for stomach ulcer; heals damaged stomach lining
- can also be applied topically for bleeding due to injury/trauma

#### 2. reduces swelling and regenerates flesh

- · for sores, abscesses, and chapped skin
- for anal fissures, cracks on hand and feet

To use externally, crush into powder and mix with honey, egg white, or sesame oil. Bai Ji is incompatible with Wu Tou (aconite).







# **ǒu jié** nelumbinis nodus rhizomatis

Temp: neutral Taste: sweet, astringent Channels: LU, ST, LV Dosage: 9-15 grams

#### induces astringency and invigorates blood to stop bleeding

- mild
- because it is neutral in temperature and has an astringent property, it can be used for any type of bleeding, especially chronic bleeding

Ou Jie is lotus root nodules. Ou Jie sounds like "OJ Simpson", so it has something to do with bleeding.

## **ài yè** artemisiae argyi folium

Temp: warm Taste: bitter, acrid Channels: LV, SP, KI Dosage: 3-9 grams

#### 1. warms channels to stop bleeding

• for cold-pattern bleeding, such as menstrual bleeding, stomach bleeding with blood in diarrhea, etc.



- calms restless fetus; for bleeding during pregnancy
- 2. disperses cold and stops pain
  - cold abdominal pain, irregular menses, painful menses
  - used internally or externally (moxa)
- 3. treats skin problems
  - for eczema, fungal infection

## **pào jiāng** zingiberis rhizoma preparatum

Temp: warm Taste: bitter, slightly acrid, astringent Channels: LV, SP Dosage: 3-9 grams

- 1. warms channels to stop bleeding
  - for bleeding due to Spleen yang deficiency
  - for vomiting blood, blood in the stool, or flooding and spotting
- 2. warms the middle-jiao
  - for abdominal pain, vomiting, and diarrhea due to cold





Xue Yu Tan is charred human hair.



Temp: warm Taste: acrid Channels: SP, ST Dosage: 15-30 grams (boil first; wrap in cloth bag)

#### 1. warms middle-jiao and stops bleeding

- for bleeding due to deficiency cold of the Spleen
- for vomiting blood, blood in the stool, flooding and spotting
- · calms restless fetus

#### 2. stops vomiting and diarrhea

· for vomiting and diarrhea due to deficiency cold

Zao Xin Tu is lumps of burnt clay taken from the base of the inside of a wood-fueled oven or stove.

## yún nán bái yào white medicine from yunnan

- AKA Yunnan Paiyao
- Yunnan Bai Yao is a patent medicine for stopping bleeding. The powder can be applied externally in cases of injury and trauma, or taken internally.
- The formula was developed by Qu Huanzhang in 1902. It became famous when it was used by soldiers during the Battle of Taierzhuang in 1938.
- In 1956, Qu's wife donated the formula to the Chinese government. The formula composition is still a secret. The ingredients are compounded by 13 separate teams, none of whom have any knowledge of what the other teams are preparing. Most people, however, guess that San Qi is a key component.
- Yunnan Baiyao is also very commonly used in veterinary medicine.

<b>di yu</b> sanguisorbae radix	clears heat to stop bleeding <ul> <li>hemorrhoids</li> </ul>	clears heat toxicity (sores, bedsores, burns)

<b>huai mi</b> sohporae flos immaturus	clears heat to stop bleeding • hemorrhoids	lowers high blood pressure
<b>ce bai ye</b> platycladi cacumen	clears heat to stop bleeding	<ul><li> clears Lung heat (phlegm)</li><li> burns and scalds</li></ul>
<b>bai mao gen</b> imperatae rhizoma	<ul><li>clears heat to stop bleeding</li><li>esp. for bloody lin</li></ul>	<ul> <li>promotes urination</li> <li>generates body fluids</li> <li>all three functions (stop bleeding, promote urination, generate body fluids) make this the perfect herb for UTI or lin syndrome</li> </ul>
xian he cao agrimoniae herba	induces astringency to stop bleeding • esp. for bloody lin	<ul> <li>clears heat toxicity (dysentery)</li> <li>kills parasites (fungus)</li> </ul>
<b>bai ji</b> bletillae rhizoma	induces astringency to stop bleeding	<ul><li>reduces stomach acid</li><li>closes fissures</li></ul>
<b>ŏu jié</b> nelumbinis nodus rhizomatis	induces astringency to stop bleeding <ul> <li>also invigorates blood</li> <li>mild</li> </ul>	
<b>ai ye</b> artimesiae argyi folium	warms channels to stop bleeding	<ul> <li>stops pain due to cold</li> <li>treats skin problems</li> </ul>
